NOTABLE INITIATIVES

FDU's Early College Dual Enrollment: This program introduces students in grades 9-12 to the expectations of college-level studies while in high school. Students can save money by earning valuable college credits that can be applied toward an FDU degree or transferred to most other colleges and universities. NOTEWORTHY UPDATES

FDU Health: For Healthcare's New Challenges

FDU Health comprises programs in our School of Pharmacy and Health Sciences, Henry P. Becton School of Nursing and Allied Health, and School of Psychology and Counseling to encourage innovation and research. Most of all, FDU Health prepares skilled professionals who can navigate the complexities of tomorrow's healthcare landscape.

New R&D Lab

In Fall 2024, FDU's Lee Gildart and Oswald Haase School of Computer Sciences and Engineering (Metropolitan Campus) will open the Dennis Turpan Research & Development Lab for Cutting-Edge Technologies and Fields. Thanks to a \$200,000 grant from the Hearst Foundations and a \$500,000 anonymous gift, the lab will support undergraduate and graduate interdisciplinary research, grantsmanship and externally-funded research.

Behavioral Health

As part of an increased focus on student health and well-being, FDU collaborates with telehealth partners like UWill to connect students with experienced mental health professionals.

Center for Empathy Research and Training

FDU's Center for Empathy Research and Training (CERT), based in the School of Psychology and Counseling, is rooted in the belief that empathy is the antidote to anger and aggression. Its empathy training services are now available to members of the FDU community as well as schools, districts and area businesses.

Social Media Concentration

Offered to majors in FDU's B.A. in Communication program on both New Jersey campuses. This concentration prepares students for growing career opportunities in social media management, content creation and technology.
