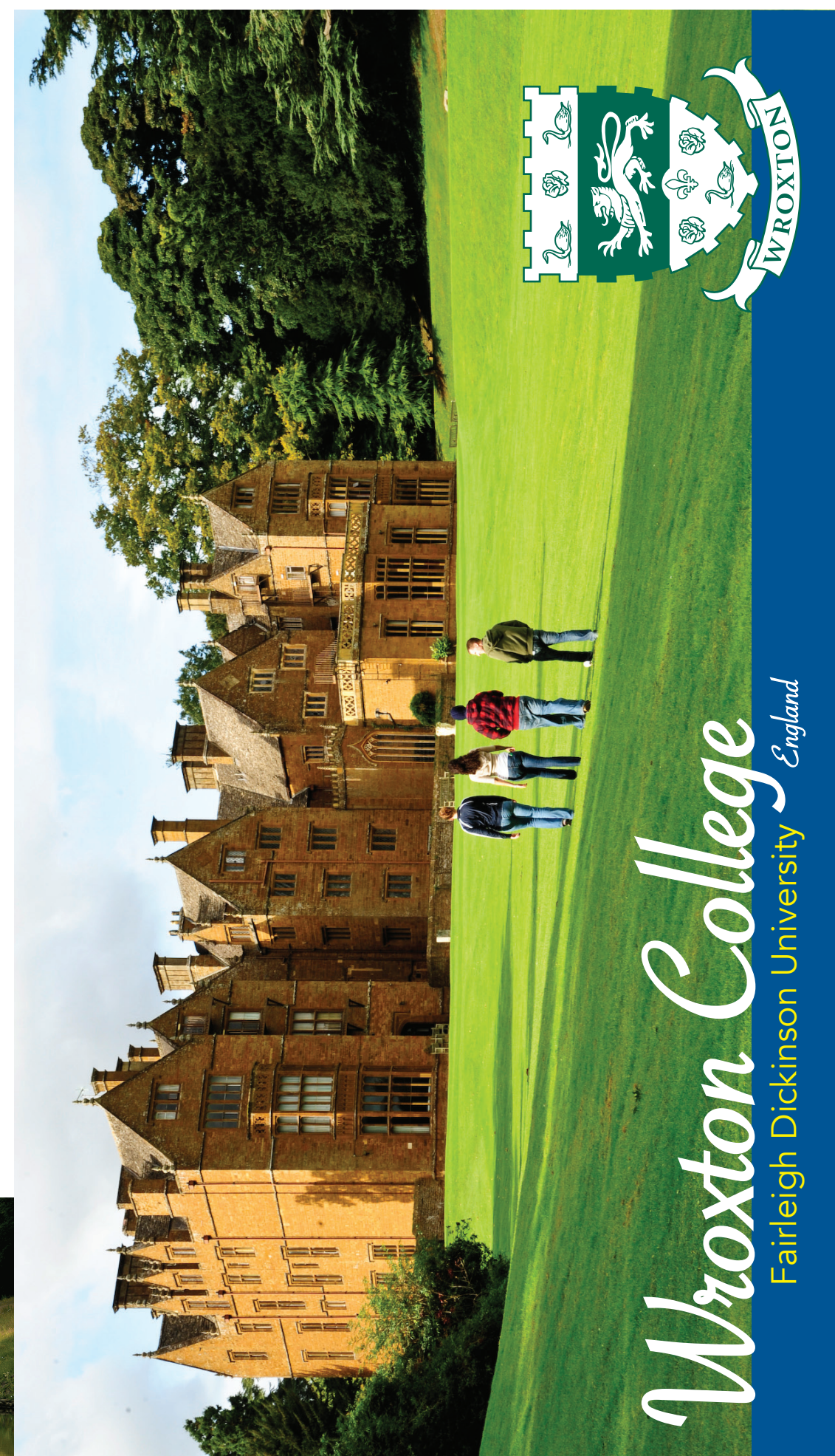

A Location in the Heart of England

- 3 miles from Banbury, England, a bustling market town with shops, pubs, clubs, galleries, museums, music venues and theaters.
- 15 miles from Stratford-upon-Avon, birthplace of William Shakespeare and home of the Royal Shakespeare Company theaters.
- 26 miles from Oxford and 75 miles—little more than an hour's train ride—from London.

The Abbey—Not Your Typical College Dorm

Students live and study in Wroxton Abbey, surrounded by 56 acres of lawns, lakes and woodlands. This 17th-century Jacobean mansion, parts of which date back to 1217, has been completely renovated and modernized. Accommodations include single and double rooms, each with a private bathroom.

- Have a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale.
- Submit a personal essay and three letters of recommendation.
- Be in good standing within their home institution.
